## Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Membership Meeting Minutes February 22, 2021

Meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm.

**Previous Minutes** – Membership read and approved January minutes. A motion to approve was made by Anelie and approved by a show of hands from all members present.

Members and Guests - There were 19 members present via Zoom and one guest.

Ulla Van Gerrevink was the winner of the membership raffle.

**Vice President** – Jill Dalton from Fabric Garden in Sacramento was our featured speaker. She gave us a video tour of the shop and discussed what they offer in the way of fabrics, notions, and classes.

**Treasurer** – Becky reported a beginning bank balance of \$10,613.50. After dues received and Made in Amador items sold, the current balance is \$11,124.35.

An audit for the year 2020 needs to be conducted. Mary Beth and Bunny will assist Becky with the audit. Membership dues are due by the end of March. They can be mailed to Mother Lode Quilters' Guild, P. O. Box 649, Sutter Creek, CA 95685.

**Secretary** – A letter was received from Tammie Crabtree, Executive Director of Operation Care, thanking us for a 2020 contribution valued at \$100. We believe this was for the Christmas stockings MLQG made for Operation Care.

**President's Message** – The updated by laws approved as written by a unanimous show of hands. Approval was seconded by Kathy Beach.

Mary Mahoney organized a MLQG "drive – by" event on 2/20. A suggestion was made to have this as a regular event, the Saturday before each meeting. Carlene suggested a \$25 donation to the church for the use of their parking lot for our drive by events. The motion was unanimously approved by a show of hands.

**Quilt tip**: If you have an empty Aurifil thread spool, do not throw it away. Fit a small seam ripper in the hole of the spool, seam ripper pointing up. Place next to your machine when chain piecing as a quick way to snip the threads between the pieces.

# Comfort Quilts Donna Swanner

At the February drop-off we only collected 1 comfort quilt.

I wanted to go over the process of the steps again for all of the members for this year. As an active member you are encouraged to donate one quilt in each calendar year to MLQG so they can donate to our community.

**QTIP**: use your birthday month as your yearly reminder.

Here is some approximate dimension for comfort quilts:

Crib 36"-45" x 45"-54" Lap 54"-60" x 68"-76" Twin 56"-64" x 84"-100" Full 70"-80" x 84"-100"

The quilt needs to be quilted and bound. If you need batting please give me a call with the size, so I can cut for you. We can make arrangements to meet. For those of you that do not quilt we have several members that have volunteered to quilt your comfort quilt. Please contact either: Suzy Morton, Dawn Schaaf, or Linda DeRosia. They will let you know if they have time or if you need to move to the next person on the list. They will return the quilt to you for you to bind. If you would like to add your name to the list of quilters, please let Donna know.

Paperwork needs to be filled out, when turning in any comfort quilt, please feel free to print out, the attached Comfort Quilt Sheet. Donna will attach the label for you.
