Mother Lode Quilters' Guild Executive Board Meeting March 29, 2021

Officers Present – President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Call to Order – President Anelie called the meeting to order at 7: 08 pm.

President's Message – We are looking at a possible in-person meeting for May. The following guidelines were discussed and approved by the board:

- 1. Masks will be required and will be made available for those members who do not have one.
- 2. The chairs will be arranged to allow for the appropriate social distancing.
- 3. Temperatures will be taken upon arrival.
- 4. Hand sanitizer will be available.
- 5. Tables and chairs will be sanitized before and after the meeting.
- 6. If you feel ill, do not come to the meeting.
- 7. If you have any Covid symptoms or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, do not come to the meeting.
- 8. A list of attendees will be available should contact tracing be necessary.
- 9. The guild will abide by the church's capacity limitations.

Trudy will mail the Covid guidelines to the church board for approval.

The May meeting will be held on the 3rd Monday of the month due to Memorial Day.

Should future meetings be a combination of in-person and Zoom? If so, does the church have wi-fi so a zoom meeting could be projected and available to those who cannot attend in person?

New quilt racks are necessary for our next quilt show due to the age and condition of our existing racks as well as the age of the persons setting up the racks. Anelie will get her quilt show committee together review the space and determine the height and number of racks we will need. Trudy, Becky and Carlene will look into the racks used by the Folsom Quilt Show to see if we can do something similar. Someone needs to go through our storage facility with a member of the quilt show committee to see what racks, items we can keep and what needs to be thrown away.

Vice President – Carlene is planning a "Quilters' University" where various members will show their methods and tips for binding a quilt. Videos from YouTube could also be used. Anelie also suggested a video of how to do mitered corners as well as a 2 colored binding. Carlene is looking at having a speaker for the May meeting who does modern art quilts.

Treasurer – Becky reported a beginning bank balance of \$9,177.50. She pointed out there is no budget item in our budget for new racks

Secretary – No correspondence received.

Adjourned – The meeting was adjourned at 8:03 pm

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Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Membership Meeting Minutes March 22, 2021

Officers Present – President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm.

Previous Minutes – Membership read and approved February minutes. A motion to approve was made by Anelie and approved by a show of hands from all members present.

Members and Guests – There were 21 members and 1 guest present via Zoom.

Vice President – Jenny Lyon, "Quilting as a Contact Sport", was our featured speaker. She discussed her journey as an art quilter and presented a trunk show of her award- winning quilts and embellished clothing.

Treasurer – Becky reported a beginning bank balance of \$11,159.35. After dues received, Made in Amador items sold, and payments for our speaker and storage unit, the current balance is \$9222.50.

Secretary – No correspondence received.

President's Message – I am sad to report that Juliene Hiatt, a founding member of the Mother Lode Quilters' Guild, passed away in Oregon with her family by her side. Juliene was a wealth of knowledge concerning MLQG's rules and by-laws. She will be deeply missed.

Old Business -

Storage Unit - There was a discussion around our existing storage unit and the costs associated with renting a larger unit. The current space is very crowded with items from previous quilt shows as well as the quilt show racks. Per Becky, our current storage rental, for a 5' \times 15' unit is \$90 per year. A 10' \times 10' unit would cost \$120 and a 10' \times 15' would cost \$150. The members determined that cost of a larger storage unit was too expensive at this time and the existing unit will be rented for another year. The storage unit will be cleaned out, broken and unnecessary items removed, and the storage bins standardized to make better use of the space.

Our storage closet at the church will also be cleaned out and reorganized.

New Business -

Future meetings - Per Kathy Beach, Creekside Methodist Church has been meeting in person in the social hall. It can accommodate up to 35 people. Trudy will write up our Covid protocols which will be provided to the church board for approval. We hope to have out first in-person meeting in May.

Quit Show Racks – Our old racks have served us well for many years but the plastic is aging and many of the parts are cracked and breaking. In addition, Curt DeRosia, quilt rack designer extraordinaire, is moving out of the area and will no longer be available to help with the rack set up. Should we look in to purchasing or renting new racks? Can we reuse parts of the old racks to create new racks that are easier to assemble? Who would build the new racks? The Quilt Show committee members will meet to discuss the floor plan and determine what our needs are for new racks.

Tailgate Drive-by - Per Mary Mahoney, the next "drive by" event will take place the Saturday before our May meeting.
