
Looking forward to seeing everyone at our Sept meeting. It should be a great meeting cause I think shopping is involved!!

Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Membership Meeting Minutes August 23, 2021

Officers Present -President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Meeting was called to order at 6:35 pm.

Previous Minutes – July minutes were read and approved by a show of hands.

Members and Guests – We had 21 members present and Diane via Zoom. There were 2 guests, Joan from the Roseville Quilt and Fiber Guild with their Opportunity Quilt and Skip. Ulla won the membership raffle.

Vice President – Our speaker for September will be Pat Fryer of Villa Rosa Designs. She will bring her trunk show as well as patterns and fabric.

Treasurer – No report

Secretary – No correspondence received.

Featured Speaker –Patricia Belyea was our featured speaker via Zoom. She gave a talk entitled "East Meets West Quilts". She specializes in making modern quilts using Japanese Yukata fabrics. She showed slides of the Tokyo Quilt festival, the largest quilt show in the world, as well as the Yukata dyeing process. In addition to her quilt making, she farms indigo in the Okanogan Heights in Washington State. She offers online workshops. Her website is www.okanarts.com and @okanarts on Instagram.

Country Store/Farmers Market - Sierra Gold has offered us two booths at their upcoming quilt show in October, one for our Country Store and another to sell tickets to our Opportunity Quilt. We will not attend the October Farmer's Market since it conflicts with our participation in Sierra Gold's Quilt Show.

Quilt Show – A Quilt Show Committee meeting was held on 8/16/21. Someone is needed to help chair the quilt show in addition to Anelie, Terri and Mary Bush.

Mary Bush and Donna Swanner will work together to contact vendors for our quilt show. Trudy and Carlene suggested contacting some of the vendors from the Farmer's Market They will get their information and pass it on to Mary.

Jenny Lyon was cancelled as the Featured Speaker at our 2020 quilt show. Is she available for our 2022 show?

Additional items discussed were raising the admission price to our quilt show and as well as possibly limiting the show to the main auditorium. Should we consider raising the prize money for the winning quilts?

Ulla will check on the quilt show signs.

Quilt Racks - Rita has been in discussion with Larry Bush about the quilt rack's construction. Larry is familiar with our original racks and will look at what can be reused in new racks. He also has wood he will donate for the new racks. We may only need to replace the fittings which should keep the cost of new racks to approximately \$500. Mary will inventory the shed and Larry will keep the racks on his trailer until the shed can be inventoried.

Board Members - The following positions on the MLQG Board are open for 2022: President, Vice-President, and Treasurer. Both Carlene and Becky have served two terms and Anelie does not want to volunteer for another year as President due to her work schedule. Mar and Ulla will head the nomination committee and contact guild members to see who would like to volunteer for the open positions.

Opportunity Quilt – Billie will make the label. The fabric for the label has been given to Rita and she will pass it on to Billie.

Scheduling our Opportunity Quilt has been difficult since many guilds are still not having inperson meetings due to Covid.

Mother Lode Quilters' Guild Executive Board Meeting August 13, 2021

Officers Present – President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Call to Order – President Anelie called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

President's Message – A nomination committee is needed for the following board positions: President, Vice-President, and Treasurer. Do we want to consider an exemption to the 2-year rule due to the pandemic? The By-Laws do not address this type of situation. Do we want to update the by-laws or have the board decide and put it to a guild vote? Anelie will ask for a nominating committee at the September meeting.

Due to her work schedule, Anelie would like to pass some of her Quilt Show duties on to someone else. She will see if anyone would like to step up and help.

There is a Quilt Show committee meeting scheduled for 8/16/21. Up for discussion are vendors, a possible admission price increase and holding the Quilt Show in the auditorium only instead of two buildings.

Sierra Gold has generously offered us 2 booths at their October Quilt Show, one for our Opportunity Quilt and one for the Country Store. Should we cancel our Farmer's Market booth for October since it's the same weekend?

Rita reported on what she learned about quilt racks. Sierra Gold gave Rita the plans they used for 36 racks in multiple sizes to accommodate different sized quilts. They go together simply in a zig-zag design and can be set up in multiple configurations. Rita talked to Larry Bush who is familiar with our current racks and thinks some of it can be reused with the damaged areas cut off. He has wood that he is willing to donate for the stands. Larry will see what fittings can also be reused. We may only need to purchase new fittings.

Mary Bush and Donna Swanner will work together on getting vendors for the Quilt Show.

Future Board meetings will be held via Zoom.

Vice President – Carlene will learn how to use the speaker so our August speaker, Patricia Belyea of Okan Arts, can participate via Zoom.

Treasurer – Becky reported a beginning bank balance of \$9,011. The speaker fee for August is \$350.

Secretary – No correspondence received.

Adjourned – The meeting was adjourned at 8:03 pm
