Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Meeting April 25th, 2022

Officers present were President Trudy Baumann, Vice President Sherry Phinney, Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc and Treasurer (substitute) Becky Podesta.

The meeting was called to order at 6:32pm.

Members present were 20 including two new members, Judi Finch and Misty Hall. 6 guests were in attendance.

The visiting Opportunity quilt was from the Diablo Valley Quilt Guild and named "Diablo Valley Pollinators"

Secretary report- No Correspondence. The March meeting minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter by Ulla, the motion seconded by Mary Beth.

Treasurer's report - The checkbook had an ending balance of \$8703.68.

Rita reported that longtime member Mary Mahoney will be moving to Castro Valley to be closer to family.

Guest Speaker - Rami Kim gave a wonderful presentation of her quilting journey to include Best of Show winning garments and quilts. Members showed interest in having her back to teach her folded Hexagon block quilt design. Sherry will confirm some available dates.

Trudy reported having received an invitation for the guild to attend the Days of 49 parade on the upcoming Sunday, May 1st. There were only 3 members willing to participate so we will not attend. Row by Row block of the month - Anelie has reported that the next row to work on has two directions that need correcting. The background block cutting size is too small, we should increase it to $11\ 1/2$ inches wide. She also noted that when stitching the blades together use the drawn line...**not** 1/4" seam from the edge. She then showed us how to make a template to construct the center half round for the Dresden.

Mar has recently visited two different guilds with the Opportunity Quilt. She has also reported having visiting Opportunity Quilts booked to our meetings through April 2023.

Country Store - Heather reported needing lots of potholders and bowl cozies. Terrie brought a box of donated towel samples that can be used for potholder construction.

Rita reported that Barb Haymond has the sign-up sheets available for the County Fair white gloving and Opportunity quilt ticket sales. The fair runs for 4 days with three 4 hour shifts available each day. Mary Bush reported having sent out all of the of contracts to the Vendors for the Quilt Show.

Terrie and Anelie reported on the Quilt show committee. Trudy will start Publicity notifications, two husbands are working on the new quilt rack parts, members are encouraged to work on quilts and quilt challenge entries. **Entry forms for the quilt show will be in the newsletters starting in May.** Suzy would like newsletter articles submitted to her by the 10th of May.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:52pm.
