

Life continues to be pretty busy in the Beers home but I still want to get people together to work. I will continue to work on this.


Please also consider trying to get all your donations to the Country Store sooner than later. It will really help with pricing and organizing.

June 27th, 2022**

Officers present were Past President Anelie Belden, Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc and Treasurer Carlene Drake.

The meeting was called to order at 6:40pm.

Members present were 18, with 6 guests in attendance.

The visiting Opportunity quilt was from the River City Quilt Guild of Sacramento and named "Route 66".

Secretary report- No Correspondence. The May meeting minutes were approved after correction of Opportunity Quilt visitation dates. A motion to approve as amended was made by Becky and seconded by Mary Beth.

Treasurer's report - The checkbook had a balance of \$8852.00.

Guest Speaker - Kim Brownell , The Wacky Doodle Quilter presented a trunk show of her quilting journey, many of which have been inspired from Challenges. She and her husband had items to sell after the presentation.

Anelie reported that Barb Haymond has recent health issues that will not allow her to continue with chairing the County Fair committee. Dawn and Becky have offered to take it over. The sign-up sheets were available for the County Fair white gloving and Opportunity quilt ticket sales. The fair runs for 4 days with three 4 hour shifts available each day. As a reminder Amador County Fair Quilt entries paperwork must be turned in by July 8th.

Row by Row block of the month - Anelie discussed and gave piecing directions for our fifth row, 'Dancing Squares' row #7 in the book. Block rows #5 and #6 are paper pieced. Anelie would like to have a class and teach the bird and flower block all in one session. Members would like to plan it late July, August or September. Anelie will give us some dates to pick as soon as she checks with a location. Mar has recently visited two different guilds with the Opportunity Quilt. She has also reported having visiting Opportunity Quilts booked to our meetings through April 2023.

Vendors - no report



Suzy would like newsletter articles submitted to her by the 10th of July.


The meeting was adjourned at 8:57pm.



Around the World in Four Days

Amador County Fair 2022

July 28 – 31

Forms & Fee due by July 8, 4 pm

Entries in Place July 23, 10 am – 4 pm in Pokerville Hall

Quilt pick up – August 1, 10 am – 4 pm

The quilts have been judged. What happens next?

During the next three days all the displays in Pokerville Hall have to be assembled and ready for the public to view on Thursday at 10 am. This means all the quilts and all of the other Creative Arts such as the Baked Foods & Confections, Preserved & Dried Foods, Clothing & Textiles, and Hobbies & Crafts.

Unlike our quilt show, the department supervisor and her helpers have no idea how many, what size or what colors the quilts entered will be until Monday morning when they began to set up the building. Color and size are considered when deciding where to hang the quilts. So is location as care is taken to display the quilts where they will be safe from being touched by the fair patrons who just can't resist touching the quilts.

The large quilts are hung around the outside walls. Unfortunately, that sometimes means parts of the quilts may be behind a display cabinet. Other quilts are hung from the ceiling which makes them harder to see but they have to be hung high to keep them safe.

The Best of Show quilt will be hung in the special display where all the "Best of" items are displayed. If that quilt belongs to one of the quilt guilds, it won't be hanging behind the guild's table which presents more of a challenge to sell "chances" on the quilt. Even so, having the "Best of Show" quilt is very special and will help sell more chances on other occasions.

No doubt someone will be unhappy with how their quilt is displayed. But please remember, everyone does their best to display our quilts so they look the best and are safe. They know how important our quilts are to each of us.

Many folks come to the fair just to see our quilts. Let's be sure there are lots of quilts for them to see.
