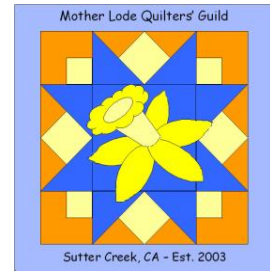

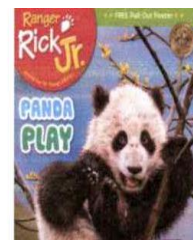
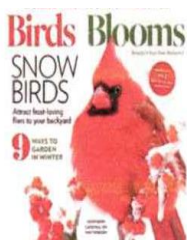

General Meeting  
July 25th, 2022**

**Officers present** were Vice President Sherry Phinney, Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc and Treasurer Carlene Drake.

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm.

**Membership** - Members present were 27, including one new member with 2 guests in attendance.

**Secretary** - No Correspondence. The June meeting minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter. A motion to approve was made by Ladonna and seconded by Bunny.

**Treasurer** - The checkbook had a current balance of \$8439.35. There was income from Made in Amador and Quilt Show presale tickets. Costs were Post Office box renewal and Quilt Rack construction expenses.

**Vice President** - No speaker but Sherry brought an Acronym game for us to play. There will be no speaker at the August meeting as that will be the day we submit entries and take photos of the quilts. We will have our Ice Cream Social at that meeting. September will be our meeting to wrap up any last-minute items before the Quilt Show, so no speaker. October will be our Quilt Show review, totals and income report. Carlene is planning a presentation on Temperature Quilts. We will also present members running for guild elections. November will be our elections and our Holiday Potluck dinner.

**New Business** - Sandy Ask from Sierra Gold Quilters' Guild has contacted Anelie about participating in a display of small quilts at the newly renovated Amador County Library. Anelie asked if any member was interested in heading up the project and working with SGQG. Carlene said that she was interested. These quilts will need to have a total circumference measurement of 100 inches or less. The quilts are due to be turned in at 8am on 9/1/22 and will be on display through the month of September.

**County Fair** - Rita and Becky reported that the County Fair judging was held over the weekend. The volunteer signup sheet was finally completed and Becky handed out parking and Fair passes to all of the volunteers that will work the White Glove department during the Fair.

**Row by Row block of the month** - Anelie discussed and gave cutting directions for our sixth and seventh rows, paper pieced Birds and Flowers. These are rows #5 and #6 in the book. We will be having a class on Saturday August 20<sup>th</sup> for Anelie to demonstrate this technique. The class will be held here at the Church from 9am till 4pm. Members will pay a \$10.00 fee and be able to complete one bird and one flower if they have their templates and fabric pieces pre-cut. Please email Anelie if you have any questions.

**Opportunity Quilt** - Mar took our quilt to the Oakhurst Guild meeting and had \$166.00 in ticket sales. Visiting quilts will be Loomis Quilt Guild in August and Auburn quilt guild at our October meeting. Mar will be taking the quilt to Paradise in August and Brentwood in September.

**Quilt Show** - Anelie, Mary, Terrie and Rita reported on the Quilt Show progress. Rita is working on the rack construction and Mary Beth has started on the Muslin for each one. Anelie reminded everyone that the entry paperwork and pictures are due at the August meeting. The Quilt Challenge entry forms were handed out and more sign ups came in for the Silent Auction. Terrie collected multiple items for the Country Store to pass off to Heather. Quilt Show signup sheets were out for volunteers to help work the show and set up days. Mary Bush is still working on filling all of the Vendor booths. **Entry forms for the quilt show will be in the newsletters. Quilt Entry paperwork is Due in August at the General meeting!!!**

**Newsletter** - articles are due on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month to Suzy for publication.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:42pm.

Currently we have collected nine comfort quilts, 2 knitted baby blankets, 4 adult clothing protectors, and 10 pillowcases.

I realize you are all working on your quilt show entries at this time, but we will deliver the comfort quilts to the agencies sometime in November after our guild meeting.

Here again are examples of sizes:

**QTIP:** use your birthday month as your yearly reminder.

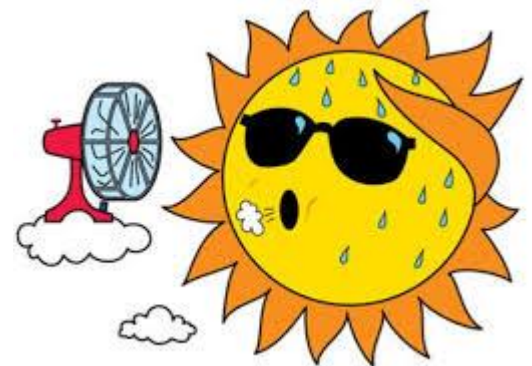
Here is some approximate dimension for comfort quilts:

**Crib** 36"-45" x 45"-54"  
**Lap** 54"-60" x 68"-76"  
**Twin** 56"-64" x 84"-100"  
**Full** 70"-80" x 84"-100"

The quilt needs to be quilted and bound. If you need batting, please give me a call or email with the size, so I can cut for you. We can make arrangements to meet, or pick-up at the Guild meeting. For those of you that do not quilt we have several members that have volunteered to quilt your comfort quilt. Please contact either: Suzy Morton, or Dawn Schaaf. They will let you know if they have time or if you need to move to the next person on the list. They will return the quilt to you for you to bind. If you would like to add your name to the list of quilters, please let Donna or Carla know.

Paperwork needs to be filled out when turning in any comfort quilt, please come and see me at the meeting if you need the paperwork. Please let me know if you need a label, or if you need backing or batting for your quilt. I can assist you any time during the guild meeting.
