General Membership Meeting
January 26, 2021**

Officers Present – President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm.

Previous Minutes – Membership read and approved November minutes (no December meeting). A motion to approve was led by Mary Mahoney and approved by Bunny Smith.

Members and Guests – There were 16 members present via Zoom and one guest.

Vice President – Jenny Lyon will be our featured speaker at the March meeting. Jenny Lyon was originally scheduled to attend our March meeting in person but will offer her presentation via Zoom instead. Carlene has been working with Rita to contact persons uncomfortable with using Zoom and offering help.

Treasurer – Becky reported a beginning bank balance of \$10,140.15. December sales were \$175 from items sold at Made in Amador.

NCQC dues are paid for this year.

Taxes are filed.

Membership dues are now due. They can be mailed to Mother Lode Quilters' Guild, P. O. Box 649, Sutter Creek, CA 95685.

Secretary – No Guild correspondence received this month.

President's Message – Rita presented updated by laws to include the use of online meetings if in person meetings are not possible. Updated by laws will be valid for 2 years.

Mary Mahoney to organize another MLQG "drive – by" event for 2/20 from 10-12.

Sew Your Stash video by Lori Holt was shown. YouTube is a good source for quilting videos that could be presented at future meetings.

Spin the Wheel for door prizes was used via Zoom to replace the door prize tickets used at in person meetings. Names of members present were added to the wheel and the wheel was spun. Winners this month were Dawn, Linda, Dorothy and Carlene.

Country Store - Country Store/Quilter's Garage Sale will take place in June, date to be determined. Possible location ideas discussed were Sutter Creek Ball Park, Italian Picnic Grounds, a winery. The limitations would be crowd control, Covid health requirements and venue availability. Terrie will check on dates available in June at the ballpark. Using a credit card for payment at the Country Store was discussed. It was determined that due to our tax status and the type of bank account we currently have, this would not be a viable alternative to cash.

Opportunity Quilt – Downtown, a Block of the Month pattern by Carol Doak and Deb Luttrell, has been chosen for the Opportunity Quilt. It is a paper pieced pattern. Each month consists of 4 paper pieced blocks, 2 stars and 2 houses/buildings. If you want to help with this quilt, see Trudy. Blocks will be available at the drive by event on 2/20.

Block Party – Blocks can be sent out with a preaddressed return envelope. The block and payment would be returned via the preaddressed envelope. Another option is to pick up the block at the drive by event on 2/20.

Comfort Quilts – Comfort Quilts can be dropped off at the drive by event on 2/20.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:08 pm.


