September 27, 2021

Officers Present – President Anelie Belden, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Trudy Bauman.

Meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm.

Previous Minutes – August minutes were read and approved by a show of hands.

Members and Guests – We had 25 members present and 3 guests, Pam, Amy and Polly from the Pine Tree Quilt guild with their Opportunity Quilt, “It Takes a Village”. Ruth Carter won the membership raffle.

Vice President – Carlene introduced Pat Fryer of Villa Rosa Designs, our featured speaker.

Treasurer – Becky reported a month’s end balance of \$9,144.10.

Secretary – No correspondence received.

Featured Speaker – Our featured speaker was Pat Fryer of Villa Rosa Designs located in Grass Valley at 12438 Loma Rica Drive. Pat has been in the business of quilting since 1981 and was one of the founding owners of the now closed Quilters Corner in Sacramento. Pat is known for her simple but colorful quilt designs. The directions for each quilt can fit on a postcard with a photo of the quilt on the front and complete directions for the quilt on the back. Pat brought many of her quilts for a trunk show as well as offering her patterns, fabrics, and quilt kits for sale. In addition to her retail store, orders can be placed via the website: villarosadesigns.com. The store hours are Tuesday – Saturday, 10-5.

Country Store/Farmers Market - Sierra Gold has offered us two booths at their upcoming quilt show in October, one for our Country Store and another to sell tickets to our Opportunity Quilt. We will not attend the October Farmer’s Market since it conflicts with our participation in Sierra Gold’s Quilt Show. Heather was under the weather and unable to attend the meeting.
