Mother Lode Quilters' Guild April 24th, 2023 General Meeting

Officers Present were;

President Trudy Bauman, Vice President Pamela Grant, Treasurer Carlene Drake and Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc.

Attendees: 19 members and 4 guests.

Trudy called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Trudy asked the guild if any members had any corrections or changes to the minutes of the March meeting as printed in the Newsletter. Pamela made a motion to accept the minutes as printed and Rebecca seconded the motion.

Carlene gave her Treasurers report and had a total of \$15,940.60 on 3/31/2023.

Correspondence – Terrie read a flyer sent by the Sierra Mountain Quilters. They have an upcoming Show in Oakhurst, CA on May 20^{th} and 21^{st} .

The Opportunity Quilt guests were from the River City Quilt guild and they presented their Modern Quilt and a custom painted Singer Featherweight machine. The Items will be raffled in September 2023. Pamela reported that she and Trudy attended the NCQC Teachers Presentation. She has selected 3-4 teachers and gave a brief description of each. Pamela will contact them and select 2 or 3 for speaking in the next 12-18 months. She will also plan to use the Hobbs Batting company free Zoom presentation for a speaker this year.

Trudy reminded members that there was a FREE table of projects, fabric and sewing/quilting items at the back of the room. Quilt Show – Terrie reported that the Quilt Show committee had a meeting in March. The Chairs are organizing for the October 2024 quilt show. The Quilt Challenge is open for a volunteer and members were asked for someone to take it on. Donations for Gift Basket items and Silent Auction items can be brought in at any time and given to Terrie. Rebecca asked for Notion donations for the Baskets. Speaker- Anelie gave a slide presentation of her trip to the Houston Quilt Market. She was there to help artist Claudia Pfiel from Germany.

She will send out an email asking for members to sign up and give a deposit to reserve a spot. Guild members will have to help by volunteering. Opportunity Quilt - Trudy gave an update on the Opportunity Quilt. It is due to be completed by the first showing on May 10th. Trudy asked the membership if anyone wanted to make an embroidered label for the quilt. Becky has volunteered for the job, as long as she has some time to get it done.
