Factors influencing the budget included our Opportunity Quilt ticket sales were down approximately \$1,500 from previous years

2020 \$2,108

2018 \$3,590

2016 \$3,685

The Board also decided, with great consideration, to suspend our donations to other organizations for both 2020 and 2021 years.

We do realize this is a passionate expense for many members but we just don't have a large treasury and felt it prudent to the Guild to do this.

The attached worksheet has actual financial data for vears 2015-2019 for history information, and also actual data through October 2020.

The last two columns are in bold, 2020 showing current information and the final column our proposal for 2021, which the members will be discussing and changing/approving at our November meeting. Our current checkbook balance of \$9.925.55 needs to sustain the Guild for 2021 and part of 2022, unless we can augment our checkbook balance substantially, the attached budget uses \$5,770 of the current checkbook balance

Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Membership Zoom Meeting October 26, 2020

CALL TO ORDER - Meeting called to order 6:38 pm.

OFFICERS PRESENT – President Trudy Bauman, Vice President Carlene Drake, Treasurer Becky Podesta

PREVIOUS MINUTES – Approved as read.

MEMBERS AND GUESTS – We had 17 members present on Zoom

SPEAKER - No speaker

 The following nominees were voted on by the members present and approved for the MLQG Board:

President: Anelie Belden Vice President: Carlene Drake Secretary: Trudy Bauman Treasurer: Becky Podesta

Voting was done via "chat" on Zoom.

Discussion:

- There is still a lack of participation by members on Zoom calls. Rita Maddock to touch base with MLQG members to determine if those members need help in using Zoom or if there are other issues, such as lack of internet access.
- Rita and Trudy scheduled a date in November to review MLQG By-laws. Updated By-Laws will include information about the use of Zoom for meetings when necessary. Updated By-Laws will be presented at the January meeting.
- Rita made a motion to leave all committee heads in place until normal meetings resume next year. Motion was seconded by Trudy.
- After discussing the generous offer of Sierra Gold to hold a joint Quilt Show in October 2021, it
 was decided to decline their offer due to the difficulty MLQG would have in holding a quilt
 show in back to back years.
- Trudy Bauman, Heather Beers, Mary Mahoney and Carlene Drake will meet to look into the possibility of a Country Store type event in May or June 2021 at the ballpark in Sutter Creek. They will investigate the park's availability as well as costs associated with the ballpark (rent, insurance, etc.)
- Trudy will provide a plan to Creekside Methodist Church to meet Covid requirements so we can resume regular meetings at the church. Those requirements include: entrance via the side door, masks required, chairs set up at a social distance and properly sanitized, temperatures taken at the door, food no longer allowed.
- There was discussion about our current storage facility. It was suggested we look for a facility that provides easier access to Country Store items, quilt racks, etc. The storage facility is paid for through March. Carlene will look for alternative storage facilities that would offer a larger space as well as drive up loading and at a reasonable price.

TREASURER – Becky Podesta presented the proposed budget for 2021.

SECRETARY - No report

COUNTRY STORE – Heather reminded members of items needed for the Country Store.

NEWSLETTER - Articles due to Suzy by November 6th.

WEBMASTER – Rita will update the website with the Opportunity Quilt winner
